

AMENDED DISCIPLINARY COMPLAINT RESOLUTION AGREEMENT
pursuant to section 55(2)(a.1) of the *Health Professions Act*

BETWEEN:

SHERRY TRY #81,743
(the “**Registrant**”)

and

College and Association of Registered Nurses of Alberta
also known as College of Registered Nurses of Alberta
(the “**College**”)

A Disciplinary Complaint Resolution Agreement (“**DCRA**”) was executed between the Registrant and the College, dated with effect **JANUARY 25, 2022**. The below constitutes a summary of such DCRA:

Through an ADCRA with the College, SHERRY TRY, #81,743 (the “**Registrant**”), acknowledged and admitted that their behaviour constituted unprofessional conduct. Particulars of the Registrant’s unprofessional conduct arises from two (2) complaints to the College and includes the following:

- The Registrant failed to adequately and accurately document their care of Patient 1, who was receiving peritoneal dialysis, specifically that their dialysis was provided one hour later than ordered and that the dialysis was running when it was not running. In addition, the Registrant failed to demonstrate adequate judgment and failed to apply their nursing skill or knowledge to provide safe, competent and ethical care when they did not start Patient 1’s dialysis but left it in the patient’s room. Finally, the Registrant failed to adequately assess Patient 1 and prioritize their care.
- The Registrant failed to accurately document patient care for Patient 1, specifically when they documented that insulin was provided at 0520h when the information did not relate to their own encounter with the patient.
- The Registrant failed to communicate effectively with other members of the healthcare team to enhance client care and safety outcomes and failed to demonstrate adequate judgment when they provided an inaccurate and mistaken report about Patient 1’s care.
- The Registrant failed to demonstrate adequate judgment, failed to apply their nursing knowledge and skill, failed to practice with integrity and respect and failed to collaborate with other members of the healthcare team when they advanced Patient 2’s nasogastric tube without a physician’s order to do so and without waiting for the physician’s order after a stat chest x-ray was ordered. Finally, the Registrant failed to adequately document

their care of Patient 2, specifically adjusting the patient's nasogastric tube, and failed to adequately assess Patient 2.

- The Registrant failed to accurately and adequately document care of patient over one month.

The Registrant agreed to complete course work on documentation, the nursing process and assessment. In addition, they have agreed to provide Employer References covering a total of 500 hours. Conditions shall appear on the College register and on the Registrant's practice permit.
